Covid support for Greater Manchester

This week, the Government announced that Greater Manchester, which includes Wigan Borough, will be one of the areas to receive more support to address increasing Covid rates.

The support will include increased testing and the option of military help if needed.

The Euros kick off this weekend, which is an exciting time for football fans.

If you're watching the matches with people from outside your household, please continue to take care to avoid the spread of Covid.

We continue to encourage everyone to do the small, simple,

things that can make a big difference, such as washing hands regularly, sanitising frequently touched points in your home, opening windows in your home if you have guests, or meeting outside instead if it's a nice day, wearing masks in public settings unless exempt, and respecting social distancing as much as possible.

Please take up your invitation to have your vaccination as soon as it is offered.


Thank you to everyone who has already done so. We've surpassed 340,000 vaccines.

This week's Covid-19 tracker has been released

It shows:


- Wigan is classed as red for new cases
- Our rates now sit at 149 cases per 100,000, which is an increase from last week
- Wigan is below the Greater Manchester average but higher than the North West for rate of new cases
- As of 8th June there were 8 COVID-positive patient in WWL hospitals
- There has been 1 COVID-19 death registered in Wigan so far in the latest week
- Cases rose slightly in Lowton East last week but not in Golborne Lowton West.

As the Delta variant is now on the rise and Greater Manchester has been declared as an Enhanced Response Area, we are urging everyone to come forward and take up their vaccine when invited to do so.

Though the vaccines don't prevent transmission, they provide the best possible protection for you and your loved ones and will minimise the risk of getting seriously unwell.

If you are a council tenant you can also pay your rent by direct debit. You will need your 9 digit reference number shown on your latest rent statement.




Digital Leaders' Week

OPENING FRIDAY JUNE 18TH A new Foodbank in Golborne

I am writing to you to inform you of changes that are going to occur in the coming months that will mean new ways of working.

St Thomas's Church Ashton (the location of ACT Food Bank) is opening a Food Pantry which will mean clients pay a £5 joining fee and £3 every time they go to pick up food. The Pantry will only serve local residents and is not a delivery body.

The consequence of the Food Pantry opening is that ACT Food Bank will eventually have to close and therefore those traditionally helped will not be catered for, especially those in Golborne and Lowton.

The good news is that a new food bank is opening at All Saints RC Church in Golborne which will take over and develop the work we have been doing in that area. Once it is open councillors will be able to refer people to the new foodbank for support.

The All Saints Church Food Bank will be open on Friday mornings 10am – 12pm at their address High Street, Golborne, Warrington. WA3 3BG. Emergency deliveries can be made.
