



COLOURING COMEPTITION

A visit from Florence Nightingale (Year 1)

"Greek Day was a fun and interesting day that was a great learning experience in which everybody had a great time. Firstly, we all went into the hall and met our teacher for the day. Then we all split up into different groups to move on to the next activity. We all got to dress as some of the different Greek Gods. That was fun because we all got to have different props and personalities. We then moved on and half of us went to class where we got to design our own Greek pots and create our own Ancient Greek myths which was very interesting. Our teacher split us into small groups and we were all allocated different plays; things such as 'how Athens got its name'. At the end we did a quiz to test us on our knowledge of the Ancient Greeks. History Workshops
