KS2 Swimming Requirements of the National Curriculum 2019-2020

Sport Premium 2019-2020 funding focus: *To increase the percentage of children meeting the swimming requirements of the national curriculum by the end of Key Stage Two.*



Summer 2020 Swimming Update

FOCUS: Additional targeted swimming provision – the impact on participation and attainment in swimming.

By the end of Year 4 Summer 2019, 61% of the current Year 5 pupils had achieved the expected standard for the swimming requirements of the national curriculum.

School wished to increase the number of children meeting the swimming requirements of the national curriculum by the end of KS2. School therefore allocated Sport Premium funding to allow the Year 5 pupils who had not yet achieved the swimming requirements of the national curriculum to continue to receive swimming tuition.

In Autumn 2019, school identified and targeted Year 5 pupils who had not yet achieved the swimming requirements of the national curriculum, at the end of the swimming lessons provided in Year 4.

Of the 25 pupils identified, 7 have now achieved the national curriculum swimming requirements. This means the percentage of Year 5 pupils who have achieved the national curriculum swimming requirements has increased from 61% to 72%.

These figures are based on the most recent swimming teacher assessments available, which were completed in February 2020. Some Year 5 pupils did continue to attend swimming lessons for several weeks after this assessment date and continued to make further progress. All pupils made considerable progress from their starting points.

SUMMER 2019 Swimming Update

Of the 19 Year 5 pupils identified in Autumn 2018, 16 pupils achieved the national curriculum swimming requirements. This means the percentage of Year 6 pupils (2019-2020) who achieved the national curriculum swimming requirements increased from 68% to 95% through additional targeted provision in Year 5.

The percentage of Year 6 pupils (2018-2019) who achieved the national curriculum swimming requirements increased to 93% through additional targeted provision in Year 5.
