In Reception, the children settle quickly at Lowton West due to the excellent support, care and guidance that they receive. Children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum which is brought to life through a range of hands-on, practical activities in both the indoor and outdoor learning environments. There is an emphasis on personal development, early phonics, reading and maths.

A large, outdoor covered area has recently been added to the outdoor provision, allowing children to access outdoor learning during all weathers.

The school uses a learning App to keep parents updated in relation to their child's progress. Photographs are uploaded by the staff so that parents can see photographs of their child in action at school!



Our Curriculum is centred around the needs of our children. We aim to provide them with exciting and memorable learning experiences that will stay with them forever. The curriculum is brought to life through a range of trips and visitors to school.

Teaching promotes collaboration and co-operation as well as encouraging pupils to become independent and resilient learners.

We follow the National Curriculum and offer a broad and balanced curriculum. Pupils enjoy being taught the following subjects

Curriculum enrichment

Exciting opportunities for every child beyond the classroom:

We strongly believe that children learn best when they have fun and enjoy their learning. We ensure that children experience a wide range of opportunities to further develop their learning.

Special events and themed days/ weeks are planned annually so that children can enjoy activities such as:

- Dressing up for World Book Day
- Carol Concerts for parents
- Arts Week
- Anti-bullying week
- Healthy Lifestyles programme
- Raising money for charity
- Year group assemblies for parents/ carers
- On-line safety days
- Participation in art exhibitions

The school has an excellent sporting reputation within the community. Children are given the opportunity to participate in a wide range of extra-curricular sports clubs and the school enters many local sports competitions, often winning or being placed as runners-up.

The school often qualifies to represent Wigan at the Greater Manchester Games and many of our pupils also represent both local and regional sports teams.

Sporting excellence

Sporting competitions that the school enters include: Basketball, rounders, football, tennis, tag rugby, cross country, athletics, gymnastics, dance, cricket, boccia, netball, tennis.

Inter-house competitions
 Inter-house competitions within school are regularly organised so that all pupils experience competitive sports.

Keeping fit and healthy
 As part of the PE curriculum, children are taught about how to keep themselves fit and healthy. They participate in the 'golden mile' activity and enjoy two hours of sports provision each week.

The PE curriculum
 Children are taught dance, gymnastics, athletics, outdoor and adventurous activities and a range of games as part of the PE curriculum. Games taught include tri-golf, rugby, basketball, netball, football and target games.

Specialist coaches are also invited into school to lead sessions on other sports such as fencing and curling.

Sports at lunchtimes
 The school employ specialist sports coaches to provide a range of sports activities for pupils during the lunchtime period.

Swimming
 Children in Year 4 access swimming lessons at Leigh Sports Village.

Extra-curricular activities

Our teachers, teaching assistants, sports coaches and other specialist teachers are involved in leading a wide range of extra-curricular activities at lunchtimes, before school and after school.

We place a strong emphasis on promoting a high quality arts curriculum. The children are given excellent opportunities to excel in art and design, music, dance and drama.

Choir Club

Our Choir Club enjoy rehearsing together and performing at the Christmas Fair, in the local community, in whole school assemblies and at the 'Young Voices' concert (Manchester Arena).

The Music Curriculum

Children are taught the elements of performing, composing and listening and appraising.

All pupils enjoy singing a wide range of songs and all children have the opportunity to learn to play a musical instrument, including the recorder and the ukulele.

Children benefit from music lessons and singing sessions led by specialist music teachers in school.

Instrumental Tuition

Around 80 to 100 pupils learn to play a musical instrument through the peripatetic music service and many enter music exams, showing the excellent progress that they have made.

The Art Curriculum

In art lessons, pupils enjoy developing their artistic skills and the school participates in art competitions and art exhibitions.

Arts Week

During our annual Arts Weeks, pupils have been involved in a range of activities including:

- Dance sessions
- Working with a resident artist
- Range of art activities
- Art projects with the local high schools
- Drama workshops
- Pottery (the younger pupils used a potter's wheel to make a pot)
- Visits and performances from local high school choirs and musical ensembles



Our facilities

We take great pride in ensuring that the school learning environment is of the highest standard. The school has a range of facilities/ resources which benefit all pupils and include:

- Three playgrounds
- An extensive playing field
- School hall with lighting/ sound systems and air conditioning
- Staging/ lighting for performances
- A large school garden with willow arch, outdoor seating area, polytunnel and greenhouse (made out of plastic recycled bottles)
- Wide range of playground equipment
- Trim trail
- Year 5/6 computer suite
- Laptops/ i-pads
- Smart TVs/ interactive whiteboards in every classroom
- Air conditioning in the school hall and in several classrooms
- Excellent kitchen facilities

Refurbishment

During the period from 2016 to 2019, the school has undergone an extensive refurbishment programme which has included:

- Extending several classrooms
- Outdoor covered area for the Reception classes
- Air conditioning in classrooms and the school hall
- New open plan Infant library
- Improved pathways for parents at the end of the school day
- New corridors within school to improve access around the school
- New trim trail on the Infant playground
- New PE store
- New ceiling/ lighting in the school hall

Safeguarding

Children are safe...

- Safeguarding policies and procedures are in place
- The school site is safe and secure
- Children learn how to keep themselves safe during assemblies and during lessons
- On-line safety is taught and promoted at all times
- Children are well-behaved and follow the 'Code of Conduct'
- Pastoral systems are in place to support individual pupils
- The school employs a school counsellor and offers nurture group support to pupils
- Merit Awards and the House Point System are rewards which encourage and promote excellent behaviour throughout the school
- Children are encouraged to attend school regularly and on time

Our Merit Award System

Each week every class teacher chooses pupils for the following awards:

- Gold Merit Award (linked to the weekly theme)
- Silver Merit Award (linked to the weekly theme)
- Bronze Merit Award (linked to the weekly theme)
- Writer of the Week
- Maths Master of the Week
- Reading Champion of the week

Our House Point System

At Lowton West, we have four houses (named after famous authors). Children enjoy earning house points and, at the end of each half term, the house points are counted up. The pupils in the winning house are allowed to come into school in their own clothes for a day!

Our Playtime Fun!

There are three playgrounds, a very large playing field and a school garden for the children to access at playtimes (some of these more so during the Spring and Summer months).

Children love playing with and socialising with their friends at playtimes. There are a wide range of activities on offer for the children to enjoy which include:

- A range of outdoor play equipment such as balance boards, throwing games, skipping ropes, hoops, large 'Connect 4', building blocks, etc...
- Designated quiet areas with benches and tables
- Specialist sports coach for Key Stage 1 pupils (daily)
- Specialist sports coach for Key Stage 2 pupils (daily)
- Gardening activities in the school garden
- Wet playtime games/ colouring activities/ DVDs for indoor playtimes

Roles in School

The School Council

The School Council is made up of representatives from all classes (from Year 2 to Year 6). This group of pupils represent the 'pupil voice' and are a very active committee.

Over the past years, the School Council have been instrumental in ensuring that new initiatives have been developed. Some examples include:

- The introduction of three new 'Reading Sheds' that the whole school can access as spaces to enjoy reading
- Ensuring that there are outdoor clocks on the playground
- Choosing the new names for the four houses in school (based on famous authors)
- Introducing a healthy snack bar at playtimes
- Choosing which charities the school should raise funds for
- Organising 'Children in Need' days
- Leading assemblies during 'anti-bullying' week
- Organising 'Walk to School Week' (as part of the School Travel Plan initiative).

The Eco-Committee

The Eco-committee is made up of pupils, staff and Governors. Our Eco-Warriors enjoy leading a range of activities such as developing the school's eco-code and monitoring the amount of energy used in school.

The Friends of Lowton West Association

The Friends Association volunteer their time to raise money for the school through a range of community events which are enjoyed by everyone.

Some of the events that the Friends Association have organised include:

- Coffee mornings
- Bingo nights
- After-school cinema clubs
- Discos
- Summer Fairs

The money raised helps to pay for school trips, specialist guests/workshops to enhance the curriculum, developments to the school garden, funding for the annual Arts Week and funding for new equipment (e.g. playtime games). The Friends Association have also purchased furniture for the new Key Stage 1 library and supported the School Council by purchasing the new Reading Sheds.

The Friends Association also regularly donate to charities such as 'Cancer Research' and 'Meningitis Trust'.

Partnerships with Parents/Carers

We encourage strong links with parents/ carers from the earliest stage of your child's education and throughout your child's time at our school. Links are developed through:

New Intake meetings, Inspire visits (for the new Reception pupils and their parents), Year Ahead meetings (at the start of each new year group), SATs information meetings, Phonics information meetings, Reading meetings, Mats workshops, other Parent workshops and information meetings.

In addition to this, there are Parents' Evenings in the Autumn and Spring terms and the opportunity to meet with the class teacher following receipt of your child's annual report.

We also have an 'open door' policy and encourage parents/ carers to come into school at any time to discuss their child's progress or any concerns.

Parents/ carers are invited into school to watch performances and encouraged to come along and support the wide range of events that the school offers.
